I. <u>Job Summary</u>: A Student Ministry Associate (SMA) serves Oak Hills Church during a 12-month leadership program for college graduates desiring to explore student ministry through the local church. During that year, the SMA will be equipped and encouraged in a variety of hands-on ministry opportunities, leadership, and discipleship along with other SMAs from our 6 multi-site Campuses.

II. Application and Hiring Timeline:

- C. Employment offer and hiring process to be completed by March 31st.
- D. Employment start date: June 1st

III. Primary Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Support the Campus Student Ministry Staff by relationally investing in Students, enhance existing programming/events and assist in developing new ones.
- 2. Assist in leading small groups, Weekend and Midweek Student Services on the Campus.
- 3. Assist in implementing existing weekly Student programming and development of new ones.
- 4. Other duties and responsibilities as assigned.
