Ask Me

1. Why was Elijah afraid and sad? How did God help Him?
2. What things in your life make you afraid or sad? How has God helped you?



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This Week

**Read Chapter 16: *The Beginning of the End*
in *The Story for Little Ones/Children/Kids***

Talk About

1. What does a red light at a busy intersection warn you to do? How about a “Caution Wet Floor” sign in a restaurant? What could happen if we don’t pay attention to them?
2. The same thing happened in The Story. Isaiah was a prophet. He knew what bad things would happen to God’s people if they didn’t change their ways, and he tried to warn them. Did they listen? What were some bad things that Isaiah said would happen?

Do Together

Isaiah was a prophet and God gave him insight into the savior that would come hundreds of years later. Read Isaiah 53 aloud together.

When Isaiah talks about the servant who was pierced because we had sinned and who was punished to make us whole again, who is he talking about?

How did Isaiah know all those things about Jesus when Jesus hadn’t even been born yet?

How is Jesus described here, as a powerful king who would conquer nations?

How would the people who heard Isaiah’s message have felt about a savior who would come to suffer?
