



PRISONERS SURVIVE BLAZE!

OF GOLD

DANIEL 3 (NIV)

¹King Nebuchadnezzar made an image of gold, sixty cubits high and six cubits wide, and set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon. ²He then summoned the satraps, prefects, governors, advisers, treasurers, judges, magistrates and all the other provincial officials to come to the dedication of the image he had set up. ³So the satraps, prefects, governors, advisers, treasurers, judges, magistrates and all the other provincial officials assembled for the dedication of the image that King Nebuchadnezzar had set up, and they stood before it.

⁴Then the herald loudly proclaimed, "Nations and peoples of every language, this is what you are commanded to do: 5As soon as you hear the sound of the horn, flute, zither, lyre, harp, pipe and all kinds of music, you must fall down and worship the image of gold that King Nebuchadnezzar has set up. ⁶Whoever does not fall down and worship will immediately be thrown into a blazing furnace."

⁷Therefore, as soon as they heard the sound of the horn, flute, zither, lyre, harp and all kinds of music, all the nations and peoples of every language fell down and worshiped the image of gold that King Nebuchadnezzar had set up.

⁸At this time some astrologers came forward and denounced the Jews. 9They said to King Nebuchadnezzar, "May the king live forever! 10 Your Majesty has issued a decree that everyone who hears the sound of the horn, flute, zither, lyre, harp, pipe and all kinds of music must fall down and worship the image of gold, ¹¹and that whoever does not fall down and worship will be thrown into a blazing furnace. ¹²But there are some (See Page 2)

THE IMAGE CITIZENS FORCED TO WORSHIP STATUE

Three men who had been thrown into the furnace have emerged, unscathed and completely unharmed. The men had violated the king's latest decree to worship the great golden image on the plain of Dura.

The king's impressive gold image stands in Babylon. Dedication of the 90-foot tall statue had taken place with a large contingent of treasurers, judges, magistrates, local and provincial officials in attendance. Under the king's decree, all those attending, people of every nation and language fell down and worshiped the image.

On the heels of the celebration, however. Nebuchadnezzar's astrologers reported the disobedience of the three Jews who refused to obey the "bow down" order. On questioning by the king himself, the three men confirmed their objection to the decree, determining to worship the God of Israel, refusing to worship the gold image. "The God we serve is able to save us from your furnace. He will rescue us from your hand. But even if he chooses not to save us, you need to know that we will not serve your gods or this golden image you have erected.'

As a result of their disobedience, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were bound and thrown into the furnace, which

had been heated to seven times its usual temperature on orders of the king. The flames instantly killed the guards assigned to place the prisoners in the blaze. But the prisoners endured the fire and exited the furnace unsinged, not even a hint of smoke on their clothing.

Nebuchadnezzar personally oversaw the proposed execution, and announced his shock at the outcome: "I see four men walking around in the fire, unbound and unharmed, and the fourth looks like a son of the gods."

Witnessed by government satraps, prefects, governors, and royal advisors, the king said, "Praise be to the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who has sent his angel and rescued his servants!"

As a result of the execution miracle, the king altered his decree: "The people of any nation or language who say anything against the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego shall be executed and their homes be destroyed. No other god can save like this God."

Saved by their God, they were promoted to positions of honor by the king and will continue in their new capacity until further notice.

Jews whom you have set over the affairs of the province of Babylon—Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego—who pay no attention to you, Your Majesty. They neither serve your gods nor worship the image of gold you have set up."

¹³Furious with rage, Nebuchadnezzar summoned Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. So these men were brought before the king, ¹⁴and Nebuchadnezzar said to them, "Is it true, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, that you do not serve my gods or worship the image of gold I have set up? ¹⁵Now when you hear the sound of the horn, flute, zither, lyre, harp, pipe and all kinds of music, if you are ready to fall down and worship the image I made, very good. But if you do not worship it, you will be thrown immediately into a blazing furnace. Then what god will be able to rescue you from my hand?"

¹⁶Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego replied to him, "King Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves

before you in this matter. ¹⁷If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. ¹⁸But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

¹⁹Then Nebuchadnezzar was furious with Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, and his attitude toward them changed. He ordered the furnace heated seven times hotter than usual 20 and commanded some of the strongest soldiers in his army to tie up Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego and throw them into the blazing furnace. ²¹So these men, wearing their robes, trousers, turbans and other clothes, were bound and thrown into the blazing furnace. ²²The king's command was so urgent and the furnace so hot that the flames of the fire killed the soldiers who took up Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, ²³and these three men, firmly tied, fell into the

blazing furnace.

²⁴Then King Nebuchadnezzar leaped to his feet in amazement and asked his advisers, "Weren't there three men that we tied up and threw into the fire?"

They replied, "Certainly, Your Majesty."

²⁵He said, "Look! I see four men walking around in the fire, unbound and unharmed, and the fourth looks like a son of the gods."

²⁶Nebuchadnezzar then approached the opening of the blazing furnace and shouted, "Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, servants of the Most High God, come out! Come here!"

So Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego came out of the fire, ²⁷and the satraps, prefects, governors and royal advisers crowded around them. They saw that the fire had not harmed their bodies, nor was a hair of their heads singed; their robes were not scorched, and there was no smell of fire on them.

²⁸Then Nebuchadnezzar said, "Praise be to the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who has sent his angel and rescued his servants! They trusted in him and defied the king's command and were willing to give up their lives rather than serve or worship any god except their own God. ²⁹Therefore I decree that the people of any nation or language who say anything against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego be cut into pieces and their houses be turned into piles of rubble, for no other god can save in this way."

³⁰Then the king promoted Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the province of Babylon.

Volunteers are equipped to provide a four day event in their neighborhood which includes a community building opening ceremony and three days of activities for children age 4 through fifth grade.



BRACELET MAKES A DIFFERENCE

Even a bracelet can make a difference in the kingdom.

Nakia Hall was at her son's school one morning when she caught a glimpse of OHC's Taylor Rogers' bracelet.

'What's that about?' she thought and asked Taylor, who then told her he was a community pastor at Oak Hills Church.

As Taylor explained OHC's mission of reaching those within our neighborhoods, Nakia knew that the interaction was more than a typical conversation between parents. It was the answer to a dream she'd had for a while: to start a small group in her home and invite her neighbors.

"God had been putting that on my heart. I used to go around the neighborhood and pray for my neighbors," said Nakia, a member of River City Community Church. "Long story short we attended the training and said, 'let's start it.""

The group started out small, but would soon accomplish big things.

In addition to neighbors who already were believers, an unbelieving neighbor came on his wife's request, readily admitting his skepticism.

"A few weeks into our study, I felt the holy spirit take over," Nakia said. "And he became a believer. He wanted to read everything. He ordered his first Bible."

And that was just the beginning.

Another member was affected by attending the group in a profound way. Though she was raised with distinctly different beliefs, this woman accepted Christ in Nakia's living room recently. Still another member became a believer during a marriage group separate from Nakia's home group.

The group now has 14 people attending, including its most recent believers, and members who've known the Lord for decades. The dynamic makes for interesting conversations and has allowed everyone to grow in their walk.

Nakia credits the group's success to the safe environment they've created to share openly. It's part of the group's mission to use their time together to learn how to tackle real-life issues.

They've found that Oak Hills' mission to help others belong, grow and serve has intersected nicely with their home church's mission: to be a church for real life.

"We're just working like the body's supposed to work," she said.
