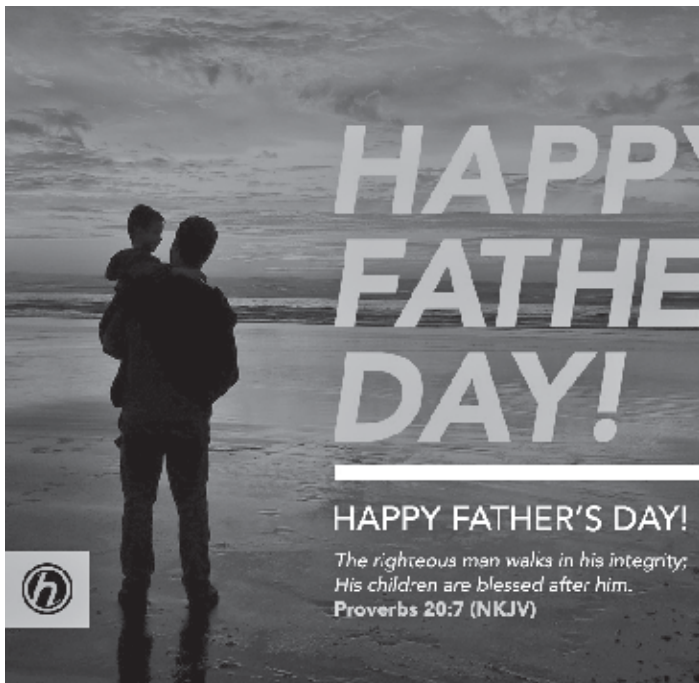

DANIEL'S VISION OF A MAN

DANIEL 10 (NIV)

¹In the third year of Cyrus king of Persia, a revelation was given to Daniel (who was called Belteshazzar). Its message was true and it concerned a great war. The understanding of the message came to him in a vision.

²At that time I, Daniel, mourned for three weeks. ³I ate no choice food; no meat or wine touched my lips; and I used no lotions at all until the three weeks were over.

⁴On the twenty-fourth day of the first month, as I was standing on the bank of the great river, the Tigris, ⁵I looked up and there before me was a man dressed in linen, with a belt of fine gold from Uphaz around his waist. ⁶His body was like topaz, his face like lightning, his eyes like flaming torches, his arms and legs like the gleam of burnished bronze, and his voice like the sound of a multitude.

⁷I, Daniel, was the only one who saw the vision; those who were with me did not see it, but such terror overwhelmed (See Page 2)

Reports of a deafening sound coming from the banks of the Tigris River were confirmed yesterday by members of Daniel's contingent. One of the chief officer's colleagues, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said, "We heard a sound like nothing we've ever heard on earth. It was so loud, we were terrified." According to the source, every man in the contingent fled in fear of the unknown sound.

"We now know that the sound was connected to the angelic visitation Daniel had after we left the area," he said.

Speculation was rampant as to the purpose and source of the unearthly noise. This morning, Daniel himself reported some details about the Tigris vision.

"It is true," Daniel confirmed, "that I received a new vision about the future. them that they fled and hid themselves. ⁸So I was left alone, gazing at this great vision; I had no strength left, my face turned deathly pale and I was helpless. ⁹Then I heard him speaking, and as I listened to him, I fell into a deep sleep, my face to the ground.

¹⁰A hand touched me and set me trembling on my hands and knees. ¹¹He said, “Daniel, you who are highly esteemed, consider carefully the words I am about to speak to you, and stand up, for I have now been sent to you.” And when he said this to me, I stood up trembling.

¹²Then he continued, “Do not be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day that you set your mind to gain understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in response to them. ¹³But the prince of the

Persian kingdom resisted me twenty-one days. Then Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, because I was detained there with the king of Persia. ¹⁴Now I have come to explain to you what will happen to your people in the future, for the vision concerns a time yet to come.”

¹⁵While he was saying this to me, I bowed with my face toward the ground and was speechless. ¹⁶Then one who looked like a man touched my lips, and I opened my mouth and began to speak. I said to the one standing before me, “I am overcome with anguish because of the vision, my lord, and I feel very weak. ¹⁷How can I, your servant, talk with you, my lord? My strength is gone and I can hardly breathe.”

¹⁸Again the one who looked like a man touched me and gave me strength. ¹⁹“Do not be afraid, you who are highly esteemed,” he said. “Peace! Be strong now; be strong.”

When he spoke to me, I was strengthened and said, “Speak, my lord, since you have given me strength.”

²⁰So he said, “Do you know why I have come to you? Soon I will return to fight against the prince of Persia, and when I go, the prince of Greece will come; ²¹but first I will tell you what is written in the Book of Truth. (No one supports me against them except Michael, your prince.

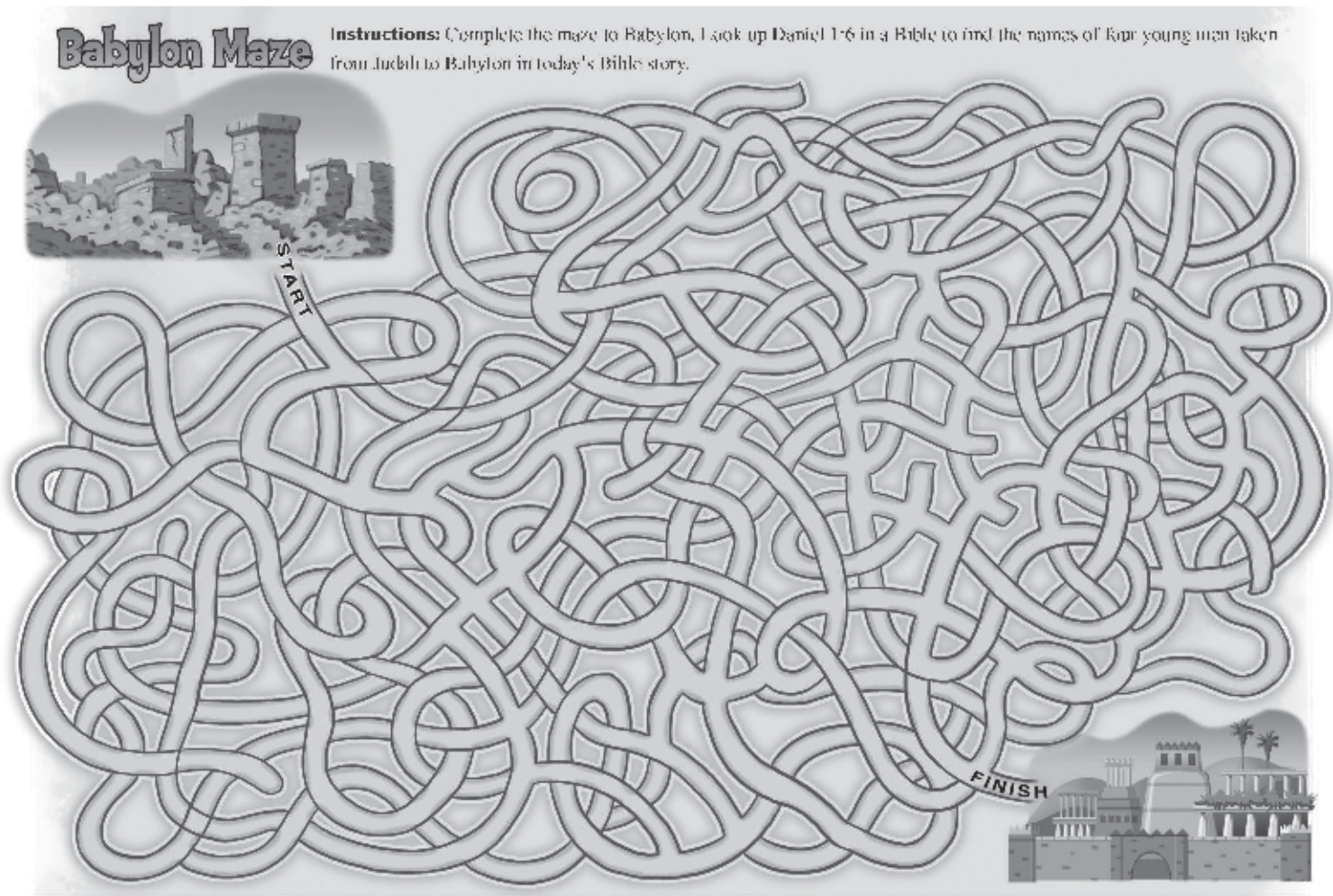

REDISCOVERING

When church “left the building” two years ago, Matt Long had no idea that church would actually move into his own life.

Even though Matt grew up attending church as a child, as the years went by he had become disheartened and disappointed. When he met his wife, Gayle, he made sure to tell her it was great if she wanted to attend, but it wasn’t something he was interested in doing.

“There were a few times she came home and said ‘I want you to go to church with me,’” Matt said. “I was a real jerk and told her ‘no, I am not going.’ It was a real sore spot between us.”

But when he found out Oak Hills Fredericksburg was holding this event that was all about community service, Matt decided that was something he could do and wanted to help.

“One of my pet peeves at the time was that I really thought churches should be active in the community, so when she asked me I said, ‘That, I can do,’” he said.

That was the beginning of a new life for Matt. He had recently had a major fallout with his family. When the message that day was about a family disagreement, he was a little surprised. Matt laughs about it now.

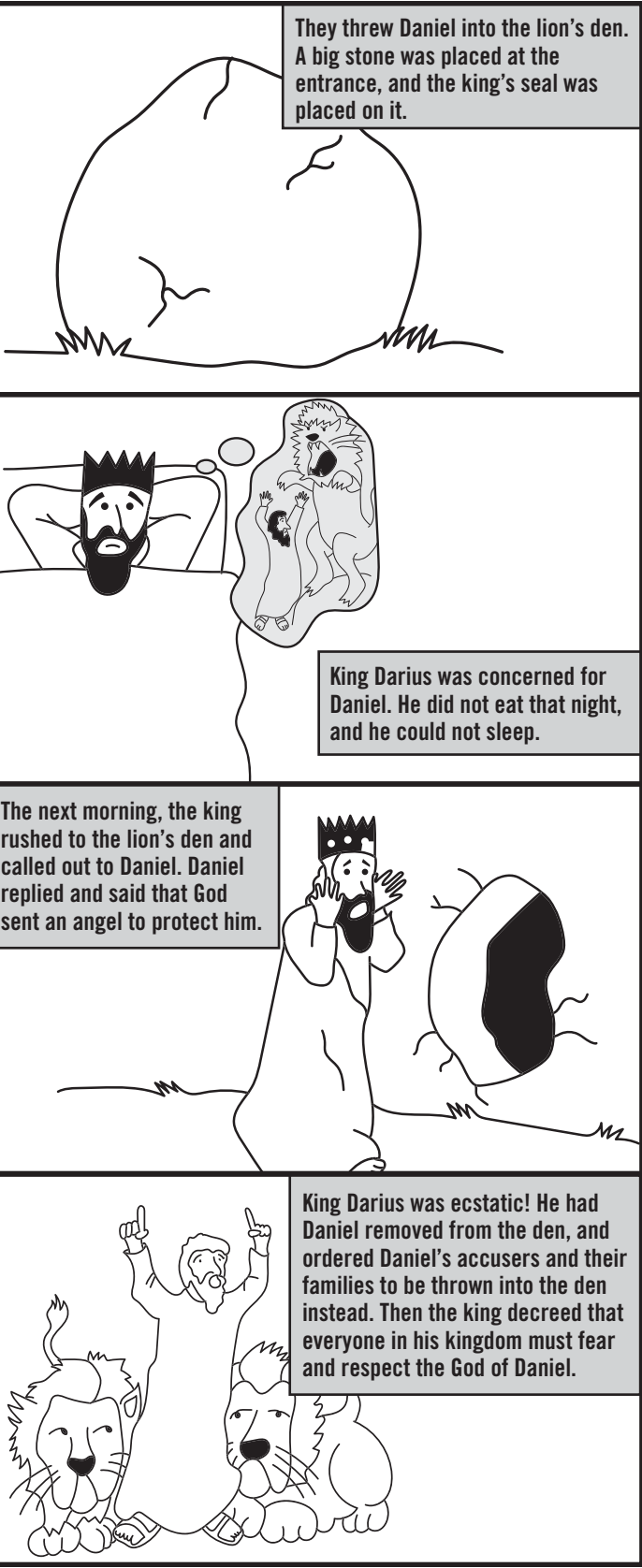
“I really thought it was a conspiracy,” he said.
