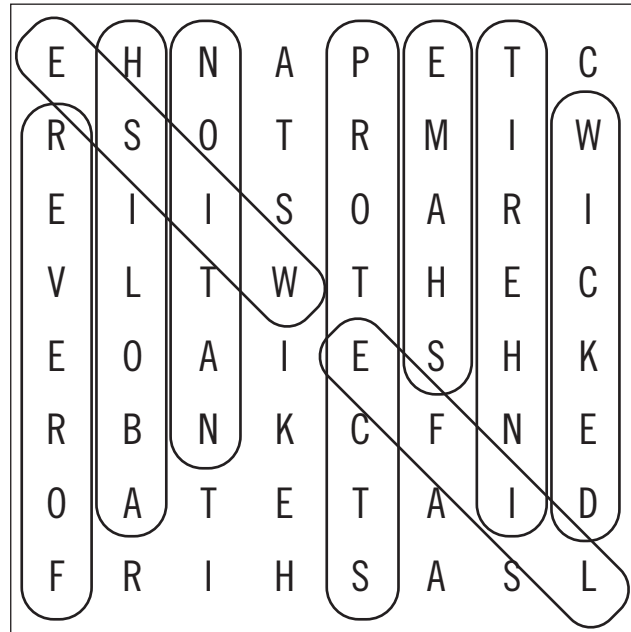

DANIEL 12 (NIV)

¹ "At that time Michael, the great prince who protects your people, will arise. There will be a time of distress such as has not happened from the beginning of nations until then. But at that time your people—everyone whose name is found written in the book—will be delivered. ²Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake: some to everlasting life, others to shame and everlasting contempt. ³Those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever. ⁴But you, Daniel, roll up and seal the words of the scroll until the time of the end. Many will go here and there to increase knowledge."

⁵Then I, Daniel, looked, and there before me stood two others, one on this bank of the river and one on the opposite bank. ⁶One of them said to the man clothed in linen, who was (*See Page 2*)

Daniel, the king's officer, announced additional details concerning the prophetic visions he has recently received. He had promised to do so after receiving an initial vision.

"I've kept a journal of these encounters," said Daniel, "and today I'm sharing it with the people in hopes they will better understand what lies ahead."

The journal scrolls, in the protective custody of palace guards, are on display in the outer court of the palace and will be available to the public indefinitely.

The prophet has given The Daily Triumph permission to publish excerpts from his journals:

The vision I saw was both startling and inspiring. It started when a man clothed in linen tried to explain to me what the end would be like. At first, I was fearful of the things he said. He told me there would be a time of great distress. We would face tragedy that hasn't happened since the beginning of time. I was afraid.

But as he continued, I began to feel at peace. The visitor said those who are wise, those whose names are found written in the book would be saved, even if we had long been dead. Eternal life will be ours.

He explained that we would be

purified, despite the wickedness around us. This encounter gave me hope. And I will lean on that hope when tragedy strikes. I will know that one day, we will live in a land where there's no more destruction, but in a time when we will receive our reward for the work we have done.

"I hope that my recollections will encourage everyone," Daniel said, "as we look ahead at God's plan for the world and his people."

⁷The man clothed in linen, who was above the waters of the river, lifted his right hand and his left hand toward heaven, and I heard him swear by him who lives forever, saying, “It will be for a time, times and half a time. ⁸I heard, but I did not understand. So I asked, “My lord, what will the outcome of all this be?”

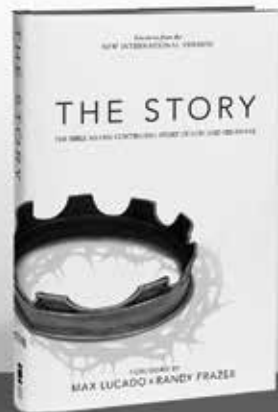

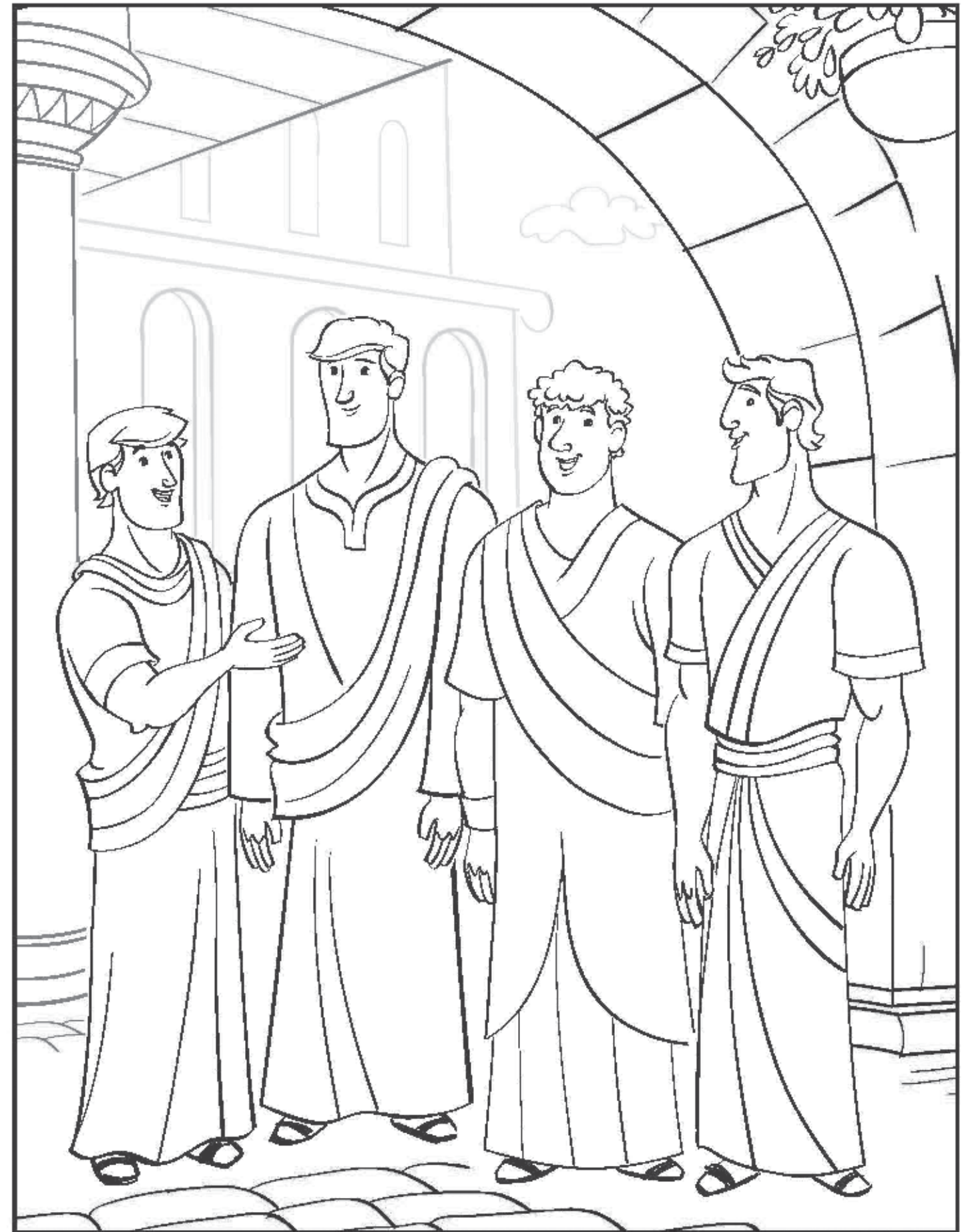

How have you seen God at work through one of your community groups?

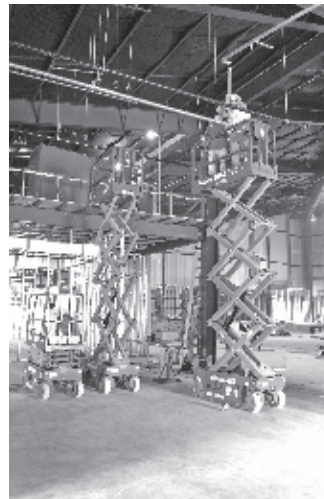
